



A Polarity Map for Spiritual-Natural Living

The Goal: A Complete Human Thriving

Benefits

- Being: one simply is, yet actively present to Life
- Mystic: one thrives in one's soul w/ inner peace
- A Higher Power: one thrives with God & charity
 - Grace heals, transforms, and perfects us
- Noble: one thrives according to one's identity
- Principled: one meets others from a POV



- Doing: one explores the great terrain of the Possible
- Humanistic identity: one thrives in one's intellect and body
- Mutual aid: one thrives with others
 - We help each other to gather new meaning / lessons
- Pragmatic: one thrives in the world
- Secular: one meets others where they are w/o judgment

Spiritual Living

Overuses

- Ungrounded (with a risk of getting lost in the clouds / navel gazing)
 - Rigid (one becomes fixated on religiosity or that divine decree offers the only enlightenment)
 - Judgmental (righteousness becomes a stumbling block to true transformation)
 - Closed-minded with regard to human progress (success, neuroscience/psychology/philosophy)
- Do you fear coming incomplete before God?

Natural Living

- Overly self-reliant (with a risk of presumptuous action, calculating self-interest, burnout, or devaluing the collective)
 - Materialistic (potentially even to the point of hedonistic)
 - Overly skeptical (reducing all to one's subjective POV)
 - Lacking meaning / scope: ("Progressing to what?" asks CS Lewis, eventually carrying the risk of nihilism)
 - Closed-minded to what could offer greater hope, joy, and peace
- How do you see life, yourself, the unknown, & the future?
